  - (v) In a longer timescale, some preliminary work should be put in hand to assess the implications for Government or possible components in any ceasefire package which might be put forward. Prisons issues might clearly figure largely in any such package.
- (vi) Finally, also in the longer term, the Secretary of State asked that consideration should be given to ways in which pressure on the Republican movement to take a constructive route could be maximised both through effective security measures which would continue to erode terrorist capabilities, and social and other policies (eg in the prisons) which might contribute to detaching people from the Republican cause.
- 3. The Secretary of State wishes to see the "steering brief" which is being prepared for Mr McConnell (ie the material envisaged at (ii) and (iii) above) before it is used. (I understand that you are coordinating the preparation of this material.) Although on leave, the Secretary of State will come into Nio(L) next week for this purpose. I should therefore be grateful if the material could reach the Private Office in London by 5.00pm on Wednesday 23 August.
