## NORTHERN IRELAND

With our relations with the Irish Prime Minister having entered a delicate phase for reasons set out in other correspondence, the Prime Minister thinks it would be useful if our Ambassador at Dublin could be brought fully abreast of recent approaches to a possible cessation of violence. This would help David Blatherwick to give advice on the best way of handling the Taoiseach. He would be in a better position to conduct business on the spot, and to act as a lightening conductor if there is further trouble.

The Prime Minister assumes that there would be security problems over sending the most sensitive papers to Mr Blatherwick in Dublin. Unless you see objection, he would therefore suggest that David Blatherwick should be asked to come over the London as soon as possible for a full briefing by the FCO and the NIO. Thereafter, within the constraints of security, he would like the Ambassador to be kept up to date with further developments. The Prime Minister has it in mind to invite Mr Blatherwick to the next meeting to consider the Government's response to proposals made by the Irish Government.
