I do not accept as credible the reasons for not proceeding with the joint declaration as originally envisaged. With regard to fear of some indirect taint from Hume/Adams, the weekend's revelations surely speak for themselves.

As for the damage caused by the leak of the Irish paper, again you now have experience of revelations emanating in the first instance I understand from the Rev. William McCrea, who obviously had it from official contacts.

I have spoken this morning to a close confident, who is in close contact with the Logalist paramilitaries, who assures me that the language of Logalist backleah does not represent their views and their position. This person now knows of the contents of the document, and in his judgement it would not lead to the feared backleah, when it is explained in full.

In all the incurrentness still strongly believe that the only occurse of action is to rise above a multiplicity of attempts from vairous quarters to stop the initiative in its tracks, and we should not allow ourselves to be brown off course. The public at large in these islands and sround the world will applicut our efforts. The prize is big enough to overcome present difficulties.
