UNGA 48 : FOREIGN SECRETARY'S MEETING WITH THE IRISH FOREIGN MINISTER, 30 SEPTEMBER.

SUMMARY

1. BRIEF EXCHANGE ON THE HUME/ADAMS INITIATIVE. SPRING EAGER THAT ANY OPPORTUNITY TO END THE VIOLENCE SHOULD BE SEIZED.

DETAIL

- 2. THE IRISH FOREIGN MINISTER PAID A 15 MINUTE CALL ON THE FOREIGN SECRETARY TODAY AT HIS REQUEST. HE SAID THE TAOISEACH'S INITIATIVE WAS THE FIRST OPPORTUNITY FOR 25 YEARS TO BRING THE VIOLENCE TO AN END. HUME WOULD BE RETURNING TO DUBLIN FROM WASHINGTON NEXT WEEK FOR FURTHER DISCUSSIONS. HE WAS KEEN TO HEAR HOW THE FOREIGN SECRETARY SAW THINGS BEFORE HAND.
- 3. THE FOREIGN SECRETARY SAID THE HUME/ADAMS TALKS HAD PUT EVERYONE ON ALERT. HE THOUGHT THAT THE IRISH GOVERNMENT'S PUBLIC REACTIONS WERE WELL-JUDGED TO TAKE ACCOUNT OF THIS. THE IDEA OF A JOINT DECLARATION WAS THE RIGHT ROUTE AND WE WOULD LIKE IT TO BEAR FRUIT. INEVITABLY, THE BRITISH GOVERNMENT WERE MORE CAUTIOUS THAN THE IRISH AS THERE WERE SOME PHRASES AND FORMULATIONS WE COULD NOT ACCEPT. HE KNEW THE PRIME MINISTER AND SIR PATRICK MAYHEW WOULD SEARCH FOR WAYS IN WHICH WE COULD SAY THINGS TOGETHER. HE INTENDED TO REMAIN INVOLVED HIMSELF. HE EMPHASISED THAT THERE WAS NO INTENTION ON HMG'S PART TO SIT BACK AND CLAIM THAT NOTHING COULD BE DONE. HE AND HIS COLLEAGUES HAD SAID NOTHING TO THE UNIONISTS WHICH WOULD TIE HMG'S HANDS. ONE DIFFICULTY WAS THAT THE INITIATIVE WAS MORE LIKELY TO SUCCEED THE LESS IT WAS DRIVEN BY HUME AND ADAMS. THAT COMBINATION WOULD NOT ATTRACT THE NECESSARY
- 4. SPRING AGREED, BUT DESCRIBED KEN MACGUINNESS' REACTIONS TO HUME/ADAMS AS REASONABLE. THERE WOULD HAVE TO BE GOVERNMENT TO GOVERNMENT CONTACTS IF THERE WERE TO BE AN AGREED STATEMENT. THERE WOULD BE AN IGC IN MID OCTOBER AND AN ANGLO-IRISH SUMMIT IN DECEMBER. HE THOUGHT THE QUESTION OF A STATEMENT WOULD COME TO A HEAD IN LATE OCTOBER. THE IRISH GOVERNMENT HAD TRIED TO AVOID EMBARRASSMENT IN BRITAIN DURING THE PARTY CONFERENCE SEASON. REPEATED THE IRISH GOVERNMENT'S EAGERNESS THAT THE OPPORTUNITY TO ND VIOLENCE SHOULD BE SEIZED. IF IT WERE NOT, THEN THE TWO FOVERNMENTS WOULD HAVE TO FOLLOW THE SAME ROUTE IN TWENTY YEARS
