DUBLIN MEETING: OVERALL OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the meeting are:

- to draw the sting of recent revelations and recriminations so that they can be put behind us;
- to restore mutual confidence in respect of the "peace process" and political development, which are complementary;
- to agree the text of Joint Declaration, and/or its future handling in public and private;
- to secure re-dedication to the <u>Talks process</u> by the Irish Government. The best confirmation of this would be a promise from the Irish side to produce, through the Liaison Group, an approved version of the <u>long promised draft Joint Framework Document</u>. (The Taoiseach has of course disowned the version leaked to the <u>Irish Press</u> on 19 November.)
- to consider a report on Security Cooperation and decide further action (through the Chilcot/Dalton Group);
- to agree a positive press line;
- to settle arrangements for the date and level of the next meeting (Heads of Government or Butler/Nally);

Fall-Back

If there is a breakdown on the <u>Joint Declaration</u>, and the Irish side may be playing for this, our objectives will be:

- to break on the right issues: the constitutional guarantee (and/or Irish unwillingness to accept the consent of principle properly); Articles 2 and 3; the Irish Convention (no role for HMG; a nationalist forum, too well advertised as a Hume/Adams objective); proxy bargaining for peace;
 - to reassure <u>GB and Unionist opinion</u> that HMG stood firm. No compromise on principle and policy;
 - to reassert the principle, agreed by both Governments in Brussels, that there can be no secret agreements or understandings with those supporting violence as a price for its cessation;
 - maintaining commitment to the pursuit of peace (all our policies have this objective.) Willingness to be imaginative, and take risks, but not compromise on principle;
 - maintaining consistent commitment to the pursuit of a political accommodation through the Talks process.
