- 2. You intend meeting all three chairmen at Aldergrove Airport with a representative from the Irish side of the Secretariat. In the absence of Mr Donoghue this will be Mr Bill Nolan. The Talks Unit need to consider whether they should also be represented at the Airport. There are good reasons to suggest that this would be sensible to deal with any administrative or procedural questions which arise.
- 3. Arrangements have been made for all three chairmen and those accompanying them to be accommodated at the Europa Hotel but Senator Mitchell may prefer to move to the Culloden Hotel at a later date. For the moment he prefers that all three chairmen should be in the same hotel location. Senator Mitchell prefers that no special police protection arrangements be made unless advised to the contrary. RUC advice is that this is not necessary and both General de Chastelain and Mr Holkeri are also content in this respect.
- 4. I understand that all three chairmen have been invited to join the Secretary of State for dinner at Hillsborough Castle on Sunday evening and that General de Chastelain will be joining Michael Ancram at the theatre on Saturday evening.
