These procedural guidelines supplement and develop the Ground Rules for the Substantive All-Party Negotiations published by the two Governments on 16 April 1996. Taken together they constitute the procedural rules for the negotiations as a whole and can only be amended by agreement, ~~in accordance~~

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David Trimble mentioned me today to brief me on UUP views of what the process now was. He said that Tuesday had been a good day, and he had been surprised to see that agreement was likely to be reached on the rules of procedure. He had seemed to be a bit wary of State

— this proposed formula gives the parties the opportunity formally to adopt the Ground Rules

— and acknowledges the ability to amend Ground Rules, should the circumstances not be acceptable to the parties. The DUP had taken this as a concession of their stand, and the SDLP had gone nuclear for opposite reasons.

The UUP believe that there was absolutely no need to incorporate all the ground rules. They feel the ground rules could be left to sit there on one side without being adopted. In this way, He understood that the UUP had had a meeting earlier today with Michael Ancram. Their view was that it was for him to review the rules he had created. They were not against using bits of the ground rules, or parts of the procedural rules for the plenary, but not the whole lot.

He also informed the Chairman last night that on Monday, after discussions convened, they should go back over previous discussion on the rules of procedure and try to conclude this. They would then return to the ground rules question and try to sort that out. They noted that, after a rest for all concerned, it would be easier to decide.
