## Strand One

## Principles and requirements

- 1. The constitutional status of Northern Ireland as an integral part of the United Kingdom must be recognised.
- 2. The nature of communal divisions must be acknowledged.
- 3. The future governmental structure needs to reflect both traditions in Northern Ireland.
- 4. A Northern Ireland Bill of Rights is essential.
- 5. The right of the people of Northern Ireland to determine their own future is inviolate.
- 6. Direct rule from Westminster should be replaced by local political institutions.
- 7. The new structure of governance should be transparent, accessible and accountable.
- 8. Greater direct political involvement should be the foundation for any new structure.
- 9. Elections should be based on proportional representation.
- 10. Participation in institutions should require commitment to purely democratic means.
- 11. There must be a mechanism to measure substantial cross community support for outcome of negotiations.
- 12. The Principle of Consent is paramount.
- 13. Institutions should be based on democratic principles and reflect the wishes of the electorate.
- 14. Institutions should be capable of development provided there exists an acceptable level of consensus.

- 15. Governmental structure should be based on shared responsibility and proportionality.
- 16. Negotiations should not be confined to examining existing models of political arrangements.
- 17. Institutions must be able to secure ongoing substantial cross community support.
- 18. New arrangements in Northern Ireland should have the maximum delegation of authority.
- 19. New institutions in Northern Ireland should have sole authority over external relationships.
- 20. There must be a normalisation process which includes the release of politically motivated prisoners.
