Strand Two

Principles and requirements

1. The constitutional status of Northern Ireland as an integral part of the United Kingdom should be recognised.
2. The right to self-determination of the people of Northern Ireland is inviolate.
3. A commitment to purely democratic means is required.
4. Any relationship between Northern Ireland and the Irish Republic must be on an entirely voluntary basis and operate in the context of broader co-operation between and amongst the various regions of the British Isles.
5. Articles 2 and 3 of the Irish Constitution should be rescinded.
6. Economic and security co-operation should be discussed within the broader context of the British Isles and the European Union.
7. The Anglo-Irish Agreement will be superseded by any new arrangement.
8. The principle of consent is paramount.
