(15) The negotiations in the various formats, committees and sub-committees, will be on the basis of a comprehensive agenda for the negotiations as a whole, adopted by agreement, in the opening plenary, as it relates to the participants' area of competence. Without prejudice to any participants' negotiating position that agenda will be such as to enable each participant to raise any significant issue of concern to them and without their ability to do so being subject to any veto of any other party in the negotiations. Participants may, by agreement, develop or refine the comprehensive agenda.

UUP Proposals

(15) The negotiations in the various formats, committees and sub-committees, will be on the basis of a comprehensive agenda for the negotiations as a whole, adopted by agreement by the relevant participants in the opening plenary, as it relates to the participants' area of competence. Participants may, by agreement, develop or refine the comprehensive agenda.
