## ITERNATIONAL BODY'S PROPOSALS ON DECOMMISSIONING

[Joint Statement by the participants]

The participants in the multi-party negotiations aimed at securing a comprehensive negotiated settlement have discussed the International Body's proposals on decommissioning including the approach referred to in paragraphs 34 and 35 in which some decommissioning would take place during the negotiations, rather than before or after. They confirm their commitment to work constructively and in good faith to implement all aspects of the Report of the International Body, in the context of the process as a whole, building trust and confidence as progress is made on the issues.

This statement is made by the following:

The British and Irish Governments, the Alliance Party, Labour, the Northern Ireland Women's Coalition, the Progressive Unionist Party, the Social Democratic and Labour Party, the Ulster Democratic Party, the Democratic Unionist Party, the Ulster Unionist Party and the UK Unionist Party.
