TALKS: FRATERNAL FALLING-OUT

Further to my earlier minute of today, Malachi Curran telephoned me to say that the Labour Co-ordinating Committee had issued a press release today announcing the establishment of a "Labour Federation" with the aim of rebuilding Labour politics in Northern Ireland. The release stated that the initiative has been spearheaded by the Labour Co-ordinating Committee, "the organisation behind the recent Labour election campaign.

2. Mr Curran refutes this last claim saying that Labour's campaign was organised by a number of different separate groupings. He reads this latest announcement as Mark Langhammer et al moving away from the Labour group at the talks.

3. In the meantime he is compiling for the Secretary of State a briefing paper which details the history of the formation of Labour so that the Secretary of State's determination of Mark Langhammer's position as "nominating representative" can be fully informed. He merely wanted me to pass on to the Secretary of State the information that this package was being compiled. He also informed me that there will be a meeting of the Labour Coalition Steering Committee tomorrow evening to try to remove Langhammer from the position of 'nominating representative'.

TALES: FRATERNAL FALLING-OUT

As you know, this morning, I went down to Castle Buildings to assist Peul Lennor of the Talks Administration Unit, who had earlier taken a cail from Malachi Curran and Hugh Casey who said they were on their way to Castle Buildings to "evict", with the help of the Admin Bait, three people who had "occupied" the Labour delegation room. (The three people concerned were Labour advisors officially nominated by Mark Langhammer, Labour's nominating representative).

2. When I arrived at Castle Buildings, accompanies by Allen McVelga and Mr Lennox, I met Messre Curran, Casey and James Masson (Labour Telks Co-ordinator) and asked first whether the matter of the nominating representative had been resolved over the weekend as forestedowed in Malachi Curran's latter of 5 July. They said that it had not, and handed over a further latter dated 6 July, to the secretary of State (faxed separately). That latter stated that in writing to the Secretary of State, Mr Langhaumer had acted without any discussion with Curran, or any reference to or authority from
