## SDLP ELECTION STATEMENT ISSUED AT LAUNCH OF SDLP CAMPAIGN ON MONDAY, 20 MAY 1996

The central issue in this election is clear. It is to create a mandate to send parties to all party talks. The objective of those talks is an agreement among our divided people, creating institutions which will have the allegiance of all sections of our people. This is the only way to achieve the lasting stability which is the basis of lasting peace. All stable countries in the world, particularly countries with divided or diverse communities, are stable because their system of government is based on agreement and has the allegiance of all sections of their community.

By doing so we can build the trust that will help us in the more difficult political dialogue. We are prepared to work through our established contacts with others in a spirit of cross community partnership to seek inward investment and to market the products of our small industries.
