2. The draft agenda is still being discussed with the Irish side. Mr Bell will be circulating a further draft agenda later in the day seeking Ministerial approval.

3. The Irish have indicated that they will try to arrive at the OAB in time to commence the Conference at 1530hrs, though, due to

the Tanaiste's commitments in Dublin, they may be a little late. I understand that the Secretary of State is hosting a function in the House of Commons at 1900 hours; and the Conference will therefore need to finish before then.

4. The Secretary of State and Ministers should expect to greet the Irish party at the Golden Gate entrance, where Information Services propose the <u>photocall</u> will take place. Any change in these arrangements will be relayed directly to you by Information Services. Following this, both British and Irish Ministers should then proceed to the Secretary of State's office for the usual <u>tete-a-tete</u> scheduled to last approximately fifteen minutes.

5. At the conclusion of the tete-a-tete, the Secretary of State, Sir John Wheeler, Michael Ancram, the Tanaiste and Mrs Owen will be joined by supporting officials and police chiefs for the <u>Restricted</u> <u>Security Session</u>. The Secretary of State has agreed that Michael Ancram should be present during this session, given the Minister's <u>de facto</u> involvement in events last week and in the light of political implications of the security situation. This session is scheduled to last approximately 30 minutes.

6. The <u>Plenary Session</u> scheduled to commence at about 1620 hours will include political matters (and implicatons of recent developments for the talks) and confidence issues (the implications of recent parades and public confidence in the security forces) but no final decisions on detail or the precise order in which subjects are to be taken have been made and will be circulately separately.

7. The political discussions are usually in restricted numbers. Those who do not intend to be present during these discussions will therefore want to leave the Conference at this point, and at its conclusion rejoin for the rest of the Conference business. 8. There will be not be an Economic and Social Item on the agenda of this IGC.

9. Conference proceedings are expected to conclude at 1800 hrs and to be followed by the Press Conferences; when the Secretary of State is hosting, it is usual for the Tanaiste to go first. The Irish party are expected to depart OAB at 1830 hrs.

10. Refreshments will be available during the course of the Conference.
