Dear Prime Minister,

I wish to formally invite you as Guest of Honour and Principal Speaker on the occasion of the President's Dinner on the evening of Thursday, 3rd October 1996 in Limerick.

Limerick City is the capital of the Mid West Region of Ireland. Principally it is the Transatlantic Gateway to North America via the Shannon International Airport Hub. It is the primary centre of Irish Tourism with world renowned names such as Bunratty and Adare - the latter hosting the Joint British & Irish Parliamentary Conference in May. It possesses some of the most advanced technological industries and international services operations in Europe and historically it is in the course of preparing to celebrate the 800th Anniversary of its Royal Charter granted in 1197 by Prince John, Lord of Ireland.
