We are writing to express our deep concern over the most recent events in Northern Ireland which have placed the peace process in grave jeopardy. The return of sectarian violence has saddened those on both sides of the Atlantic who have worked tirelessly to bring peace and justice to that troubled island. While we 25 remain heaveful that both governments and all-parties can restore confidence and trust, we do have serious questions over deci and that proceeded and followed the stand-off at Drumcree.

In particular, we wish to condemn in the strongest possible terms, the decision of the British government and the Royal Ulster Constabulary (RUC) to allow Orange Order marches to proceed through predomin stely Catt; lie neighborhoods in Portadown and Belfast triggering the worst violence in Northern Ireland in a generat on. At best, the annual marches along the Garvaghy Road and the Ormeon Road are insensitiv and irresponsible. At worst, they are provocative displays of triumphalism which have historically led to configuration and violence. It is our belief that those who forced the government and the RUC to capitulate to the threats of the Orangemen, including Ulster Unionist Party (UUP) leader David Trimble, must be hald accountable for their shameful actions.

Wie are equally concerned about the appalling lack of police protection in the nationalist neighbort ands folk wing the Orange marches that resulted in many Catholic families being intimidated, harassed and burned out of their homes. Quite simply, the actions of the British government and the RUC over the past ten da /s have reinforced nationalist's fears of discrimination, lack of democratic and human rights and accond-cass citizenship. We join the Taioseach John Bruton, Social Democratic and Labor Party (SDLP) leader John : Tume, and Cardinal Cahal Daly in expressing our outrage over the RUC's failure to protect berla commit tities equally.
