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### REPATRIATION OF TELEMINET PRISONERS TO THE REPUBLIC OF IRELAND

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We met with the Home perstary yesterday to discuss repatriations of Irish terrorist prisoners to the Republic.

2. At the meating at was agreed that before proceeding with action on three approximations which have been approved by the Home Secretary, the stew of No.10 and NIO should be sought regarding any timing sensitivales.

3. The legal representatives of the three prisoners have said that they intend to be Judicial Review applications today on the grounds of delay in the decision making process.

4. In view of this it was agreed that No.10 and NIO should be consulted by telephone with a view to obtaining a response today if possible.

5. Catherine Byrne das agreed to contact NIO. David Redhouse said that he would are you to call No.10 in his absence from the office today.

6. I attach a notice points to be made in the call, together with background internation which may be used as necessary. If you require any further details please call me.

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REPATRIATION TO THE REPUBLIC OF IRELAND OF THREE TERRORIST PRISONERS - NOTE FOR TELEPHONE CALL TO NO. 10

The Home Secretary has decided to agree to the requests of three terrories prisoners for repatriation to the Republic of Ireland.

There may be some press interest in the movement of these prisoners (although they are determinate sentence prisoners and unlikely to attract individual attention). Two earlier repatriations of terrorist prisoners to the Republic attracted considerable attention in the Republic itself and some, but short lived, interest here.

Given the general sensitivity of terrorist prisoner issues and the ongoint talks in Belfast, the Home Secretary would be grateful to know of any particular concerns No. 10 may have regarding the timing of the movement of the prisoners to the Republic (enquiries are also being made of NIO).

(Note: Although the Home Secretary has agreed to these requests the prisoners must consider and sign the relevant consent forms. The Irish authorities must then obtain warrants from analr own courts. This process may take up to 6 weeks given that there are no compelling compassionate or other urgent factors.)

### Background (may be threwn on as needed)

The Home Secretary with to Northern Ireland Committee colleagues on 25 April about the regatriation requests. In particular, the Home Secretary we concerned about the implications of the Irish authorities' decreach to terrorist prisoner releases during the ceasefire for the integrity of the sentences of those requesting repatriation should the requests be agreed.

Irish officials had previously indicated that <u>maye in exceptional</u> <u>circumstances</u> repatriated prisoners could expect to serve 75% of the remainder of their sentences at the point of transfer to the Republic. The Home Secretary therefore wrote (30 May) to the Irish Minister for Justice seeking clarification of the circumstances which might warrant "exceptional" treatment. The Irish Minister confirmed (21 June) that future developments in Northern Ireland might fall into that category but has indicated that such developments would lead to consultation with the British Government on prisoner issues.

There are 14 other outstanding terrorist repatriation applications. There will be referred to the Republic in due course. Decisions in these cases will be taken in the light of all the relevant circumstances and the undertakings provided by the Irish authorities in respect of each case.

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## REPATRIATION OF THEE TERRORIST PRISONERS TO THE REPUBLIC OF

Lines to take

- Agreement has been given to requests for repatriation to the Republic of Ireland submitted by three prisoners (Doherty, WcFhirein and O'Brien).
- The Home Secret will be expected to serve the remainder of their senteries. In prison, in the Republic.
- The formal condition of the prisoners to repatriation is awaited.

The repatriation will take place under the terms of the European Convention on the Transfer of Sentenced Persons and the provisions of the 1984 Repatriation of Prisoners Act.

The Convention repaires for the continued enforcement of the sentences of those repatriated. It is our policy not to agree to repatriation where any reduction in time to serve would be likely to result.

#### If needed

- Following repair ation the prisoners will be treated as though they had then sentenced in the Republic of Ireland.
- As required under the Convention the authorities in the Republic have in wided information about how the sentences will be administered following repatriation.

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
