REINSTATED SECURITY MEASURES

Points to Make

- · We have not as yet returned to the levels of security at 31 August 1994.
- · Security Force response continues to be a measured and proportionate one.
- · Further measures may be necessary if campaign intensifies.
- · Increased security measures are a direct response to actions of terrorlets.

Recent change to Security Regime

- · Army adopted a higher profile. Regular patrols in border areas and in parts of Belfast. No troops however on streets of Londonderry yet.
- · Increase in number of vehicle check points established.
- · Some physical security measures reinstated around vulnerable RUC stations.
- Town centre barriers closed as necessary during darkness.

Recent Finds

- Belfast 1000 lbs of home made explosive in • 31 December van in grounds of Belfast Castle.
- South Armagh 5 barrels with 250 lbs of • 5 January explosives hidden in wall. Had been in position for some time.
