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- (v) I had seen Gerry Adams' remarks about the value of confidence building measures. But confidence was clearly a two-way street.

I then asked her to confirm that she had got what I had said. She said that she had and asked when a reply could be expected. Press Line (Only if needed)

I suggest that if needed the press line might be as follows:

Are you in contact with Sinn Fein?

Any serious approach from Sinn Fein would be given careful consideration. But everyone knows that any real advance requires an unequivocal restoration of the IRA ceasefire.

Meetings with Sinn Fein?

There will be no meetings between Ministers and Sinn Fein until an unequivocal ceasefire is in place. Like the last Government, we do not rule out in principle the possibility of meetings between Officials and Sinn Fein to ensure there are no misunderstandings about our position. In practice agreement to such a meeting would of course depend on events on the ground. There have been no such meetings since February 1996.
