I wrote to you on 15 May 1997, on behalf of the Bloody Sunday families, requesting a meeting on a planned visit to London, then scheduled for Thursday, 29 May 1997 (copy attached).

The families have asked me to inform you that their visit to London has, due to advice from several MP's, been postponed until Monday, 2 June 1997. The opportunity to meet with you on that date would again be sincerely valued by the families, for the same reasons outlined in my previous letter.

The Taoiseach, John Bruton, TD, and Tanaiste, Dick Spring, TD, will meet with the families on next Wednesday, 28 May 1997, to brief them on the contents of the Irish Government's Bloody Sunday dossier which will be presented to the UK Government in the very near future. The families will also be received by President Mary Robinson later that day.
