Dear John,

DISCUSSIONS WITH PADDY TEAHON

- 1. I have read with interest your three faxes of 18 May. On the Prime Minister's speech you will have seen my telegram number 158 recording the favourable reaction here.
- 2. As I mentioned to you on the telephone on Saturday, I called on Paddy Teahon late on Friday afternoon. I had a further telephone conversation this morning, when he rehearsed the points in your letter on contacts with Sinn Fein.
- 3. In both conversations Paddy expounded at some length on our failure to engage substantively at the talks on 8 May, and to consult in advance about the speech. The Irish side were hurt, Paddy said. I responded by saying that to expect substantive engagement from a government which had been in office for under a week was unrealistic; and that prior consultation on the speech risked unwelcome leaks, of which there had been a number of unfortunate examples. I encouraged Paddy to follow the example of Dr Mowlam, who is reported as saying that she has learnt to have a short memory on issues of this nature. Paddy had the grace to laugh.
- 4. I am quite clear that we did, as you say, act properly over both the meeting and the speech. However, all this does underline the central message of my minute of 2 May, "Working with the Irish on Northern Ireland", which emphasised the crucial importance of close personal relationships between members of the two Governments.
