Dear Prime Minister,

On Thursday, 29 May 1997, a representative of all 14 families who lost a loved one on Bloody Sunday, together with two of the wounded, will visit Westminster. During their visit the delegation hopes to meet with many of the 65 MP's who signed the House of Commons Motion on 29th January 1997, calling for the repudiation of the findings of the Widgery Tribunal and the need for a re-examination of the events of the day.

I am writing on behalf of the families to request a meeting with you on May 29, 1997. The families would value the opportunity of expressing their hopes that your Government will ensure that an honest reappraisal of the Bloody Sunday events will contribute both to their own peace of mind and a lasting peace in Ireland.

The families will travel from Dublin following a briefing with the Irish Government concerning the Bloody Sunday dossier it is currently finalising for presentation to the British Government.

We look forward to your response.
