Many thanks for your letter of 9 June. The Secretary of State agrees with and welcomes the Prime Minister's attached. comments.

My Secretary of State suggests that tomorrow's meeting should therefore focus on the handling issues you raise.

On these, my Secretary of State shares the Prime Minister's concerns about being seen to negotiate the text of any speech or article. Nevertheless, she remains convinced that, to secure support from the Irish and the Americans and to get the best chance of a positive response from the IRA, we need to set out the substance of our position in writing in advance to these two Governments and to Sinn Fein.

Given the Prime Minister's concerns, however, she suggests that we do not show anyone outside of the Government the text of the Prime Minister's speech or article. That must be a text for us alone to work on, so that we can insist it has not been negotiated or cleared with anyone.

Instead, she suggests that officials should now write to Sinn Fein putting on the record the positions which they have already explained across the table in their meetings with Sinn Fein on the basis of the instructions Ministers gave them. They should also add the one final detail which they promised but did not fill in - the date or time period we have in mind. They would offer one further meeting to go through these positions in substance before the Prime Minister issued his speech or article. A draft of such a letter is attached.

The advantages are:

- we do not need to show the text of the Prime
   Minister's speech or article to anyone;
- the letter to Sinn Fein would primarily be a written record of what has already, on instructions, been said to them;

- the adding of the time period we have in mind completes the picture so Sinn Fein know what we propose but are not being consulted about the terms in which it is announced;
- in the inevitable event of disputes about what was or was not said in these meetings the letter provides an authoritative account of the Government's position, protecting it from misrepresentation. If necessary, it could subsequently be published;
- we make it clear that there will only be one further meeting before our position is made public, so avoiding being drawn into an open-ended series of meetings.
