REDUCTION IN RISK CATEGORY OF PROVISIONAL IRA PRISONERS IN SSUS: RESPONDING TO PRESS ENQUIRIES.

It is probable that once the moves associated with this downgrading exercise get underway, news of the change in security classification will begin to filter out via the prisoners concerned.

SECURITY RECLASSIFICATION OF EXCEPTIONAL RISK PRISONERS

Following a regular security classification review, the Prison Service has today downgraded the security categorisation of 14 prisoners, 13 of whom are convicted of, or charged with, terrorist offences. The 14 are all currently held in Special Secure Units (SSUs).

They will now be transferred from where they have been held, to normal locations in the main parts of the six highest security establishments in the English prison system.

The decision to reclassify their security is entirely operational and was taken by the Prison Service's Director of Dispersals, Phil Wheatley. The move is based on a reduction in security risk, and follows thorough assessment by the Prison Service in consultation with the police.

From today the 14 are downgraded from exceptional risk Category A prisoners to high risk Category A. Nine are sentenced prisoners and five are awaiting trial. The reclassification means:

- they are no longer required to be held in SSUs;
- they are now eligible for closely and separately supervised 'open' visits, enabling a degree of physical contact with the visitor (in SSUs visits are routinely 'closed' with a screen separating the individuals)
- they have access to a greater range of regime activities within prison and wider association with other inmates.

The Prison Service keeps security classifications regularly under review.

As a result of these changes the SSU at Full Sutton will be mothballed but will be available for immediate use if required. The other SSUs are located at Whitemoor in Cambridgeshire and Belmarsh in London. The other three dispersal prisons are Frankland, near Durham, Long Lartin in Worcestershire, Wakefield, Yorkshire.
