SS/NIO and Adams talks: Readout from Quentin Thomas NIO

A full note on this meeting will be completed by David Brooker of the NIO and should be with us later today.

Quentin supplied a quick readout of the main areas covered:

The meeting lasted two hours and consisted of six on each side.

It was a good meeting in terms of tone and covered wide ranging issues:

- i) SS/NIO trusted that cease fire would be maintained in both word and deed and hoped that SINN Fein would ensure this was so, so that they could join in the talks process.
- ii) SS/NIO also said that they were committed to the joint line on decommissioning and hoped SINN Fein would join this commitment as soon as possible.
- iii) Parades SINN Fein had been helpful in Derry
- iv) SINN Fein brought up the subjects of Prisoners, RUC, Bloody Sunday and Constitution. On the latter they wanted to work to end partitioning and again commented on the "Unionist" tone of the PM's speech in Belfast. SS/NIO mostly responded without substance to all the above.
