Prime Minister's Meeting with Mr Ahern, 12 December: Briefing

The Prime Minister will meet the Irish Prime Minister (Taoiseach), Bertie Ahern on Friday 12 December for a bilateral meeting in the margins of the European Council. It seems likely that most of the brief discussion will focus on the Northern Ireland talks process. The Taoiseach will want to say he has discussed freedom of transit for Irish beef exports. There should also be an endorsement of the East/West Interdepartmental cooperation exercise, and the associated communique and summary paper which it is planned to issue from the meeting.

Our key objectives are:

- To hold a constructive discussion on Northern Ireland (see Flag B for specific objectives and steering brief);
 — A possible, draft statement is alkahed;
- To issue a joint statement reaffirming the programme of cooperation between Britain and the Republic of Ireland;
- To underline that everything possible is being done to guarantee free movement of Irish beef through British ports;
- To listen constructively to, and seek to assuage where possible, any Irish concerns on bilateral issues (eg "Bloody Sunday", prisoners etc)
