

- 1. The Prime Minister will wish to explain the current spending pressures on the Government and indicate the difficulties in making funds available to farmers at a time when other deserving cases cannot be aided. However representations from farming leaders are still being considered and the situation is being kept under review.
 - 2. Farmers must not think that they can get results through street protest, illegal action or interference with the free movement of goods.
 - The Government does not believe that unlimited intervention is good 3. either for farmers or for the Community. However the short-term plight of farmers in Northern Ireland is recognised and representations have been made to the Commission at the highest levels to seek to have a further round of intervention for Northern Ireland. Jack Cunningham raised this at his meeting with Commissioner Fischler yesterday.
 - Every possible effort is being made to secure a lifting of the export ban, 4. initially in Northern Ireland. I have raised this matter personally with Santer on a number of occasions. We are still hopeful that the Export Certified Herds Scheme will be on the agenda for the meeting of the Standing Veterinary Committee.
