John Holmes to whom I spoke this morning noted that your Secretary of State was keen to make some sort of statement on "Bloody Sunday" before the Channel 4 documentary is broadcast on Tuesday 6 January. This would mean getting something approved by the Prime Minister over the weekend at the latest. John Holmes asked me to have a first stab at a draft which would not go as far as that we were considering before Christmas, but would still say enough about "Bloody Sunday" to put certain facts on record. It would also make it less necessary/desirable to respond to the television documentary.
