The murder attempt comes less than a month after Sunday Life exclusively revealed a Provo threat to kill two drug

pediars. Direct Action Against Direct Action Against Drugs — a cover name for the IRA — warned that it would kill those it held reaponsible for a grenade biltz on Sinn Fein's west Belfast HQ in early November.

As feers grow that the showting marks the re-

shooting marks the re-emergence of DAAD, security sources said they believed that Campbell had been the Campbell had been the victim of a case of mistaken identity. The 29-year-old Poleglass man, a convicted drug dealer, had survived an apparent IRA murder bid in April 1995.

Campbell was shot in the head during a shoot-out at his Colinbrook Crescent home, just days after being released from prison on a drugs

He later appeared in court charged with firearms offences, relating to the murder bid incident.

A Crown lawyer claimed Campbell had been targeted by the IRA "who would prefer to deep control of the profit of drugs". Campbell who was on beil at the time - pleaded with the judge to be remanded in custoffy.

judge to be remanded in custody.
His lawyer told the court: "He might not be alive by Christmas if his ball is not revoked."
According to sources, Campbell foiled his would-be assassins this weak hy wearing a builet

week by wearing a bullet proof vest.

Republicans in west Republicans in West Belfast are also claiming that Campbell had been lured to the Meadow's Tavern for a meeting with the IRA, after being given assurances about his safety.
