PUBLICATION OF HUME/ADAMS: TIMING

Michael Ancram asked me to prepare a few notes as an aide memoire for the Secretary of State's VCR discussion this evening.

2. Hume is apparently to meet Adams on Wednesday. The Irish side report that Sinn Fein are considering the text and that they will meet the Irish again perhaps on Saturday. The Americans are taking a close interest. If this exercise were being carried forward privately there would be a strong case for waiting the outcome of these activities. The fact that Mr Trimble has seen the text is another constraint. He is not however happy with what he has seen and there is a case for HMG delaying publication until at least some of the players would support its position.

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3. Adams has however now gone public strongly hinting that HMG's proposals are not acceptable. This means that any delay risks being seen as a period where we negotiate a new position. This accordingly tilts the argument somewhat towards publication this week.

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Publish on Wednesday

For

Avoid extending the delay.

Avoids the appearance that we are in negotiation.

Responds to Adams public signal that our scheme is unacceptable.

Picks up the hint that Sinn Fein will, in any case, "redouble its efforts" to secure the peace process.

Publish on Thursday

For

Brings exercise to early conclusion.

Dampens destabilisng effects of uncertainty, UUP concern etc.

Gives time for careful launch plan centering on Prime Minister's questions.

Against

Leaves little time to line up US, Irish Government, Hume, Trimble etc.

Looks like a panic reaction.

Risks allienating Hume (who is to see Adams on Wednesday), Irish and Americans.

NIO Ministers unavailable.

Against

Will mean publishing before efforts of Hume, Irish Government and, probably, US Government have matured.

HMG is likely to be isolated - even UUP unhappy.

Publish next week

For

Gives time for efforts of Hume, Irish Government and Americans to mature.

Increased chance of an end game where HMG is supported by Americans and Irish Government.

Increases chances of securing ceasefire (but only if we are prepared to modify our position perhaps towards the <u>Christmas break</u> scheme perhaps originating in Washington).

Against

Will mean extended delay and destabilisation with much now being said publicly.

Will lead to appearance of HMG negotiating for a ceasefire.

Will maximise UUP concern (though they appear to be unhappy with the present text).

HMG loses initiative.

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
