REPATRIATION OF PRISONERS TO REPUBLIC OF IRELAND DEREK DOHERTY, PAIRIC NACFHLOINN & MICHAEL O'BRIEN

- The Home Secretary has agreed to the repatriation of Derek Doherty, Pairic MacFhloinn & Michael O'Brien.
- Doherty was sentenced at the Central Criminal Court on 21 October 1994 to 25 years' imprisonment for Conspiracy to cause explosions likely to endanger life. His co-defendant was permanently transferred to Northern Ireland on 21 July 1995.
- MacFhloinn was sentenced at the Central Criminal Court on 10/11 February 1994 to 35 years' imprisonment for kidnapping, conspiracy to cause explosions, attempted murder and possession of a firearm with intent.
- † O'Brien was sentenced at the Central Criminal Court on 31 March 1993 to 18 years' imprisonment for attempted murder and possession of a firearm.
- † The repatriation of prisoners between the UK and the Republic of Ireland takes place under the provisions of the Council of Europe Convention on the Transfer of Sentenced Persons.
 - All requests for repatriation to foreign jurisdictions, including the Republic, will continue to be considered on their individual merits.
 - The UK's firm policy is not to agree to repatriation if, as a consequence, a prisoner would be likely to receive a substantial reduction in time to serve.

The repatriations have been agreed on the basis of information supplied by the Irish authorities about the continued enforcement of the prisoners' sentences.

- The prisoners have consented to their repatriation and the Irish Court have granted warrants for their continued detention.
- These transfers will take the total number of PIRA prisoners repatriated to the Republic of Ireland to five.
