MEETING WITH TAOISEACH: POINTS TO MAKE

Sinn Féin

- 1. Grateful for your support. How did your meeting with Adams go on Tuesday? Will they rejoin on 9 March?
- I plan to see Adams [next week/week beginning 9 March]. Anxious to avoid keeping them centre stage, but want them on board if possible. <u>Better in than out</u>.

Negotiations end-game

- 3. We must show progress or the process risks collapse. Believe the UUP are in the market for a genuine, realistic deal. How are your contacts with them going?
- 4. The key steps are:
 - 23 March: <u>overall proposals tabled</u>; intensive negotiations with parties, possibly residential in Wales;
 - 9 April: <u>agreement</u> reached; referendum order passed; referendum campaign;
 - 7 May: referendum;
 - June: possible Assembly elections (but parties may prefer Autumn though there is the potential for the process to unravel).
- 5. Can you meet this timetable? Realistic proposals will only come from two Governments. Suggest our <u>officials should now work up joint proposals for us to review</u> <u>around 9 March</u>. Aim to <u>table by 23 March</u>, after briefing/consulting the main parties.

- 6. Must take UUP and SDLP, and if possible the rest of the talks process with us. So important:
 - no suggestion Governments are coming with 'take it or leave it' proposals;
 - we agree when we brief/consult the main parties so none can claim unfair treatment (eg start briefing after 9 March);
 - we think carefully about presentation in the talks. <u>UUP might find proposals</u>
 <u>presented by Mitchell easier</u> (even though two Governments will have to do the work).
- 7. Let's keep in touch. A lot is at stake we must each monitor progress carefully.
