In the context of my visit to Lisbon, and possibly meeting with the British P.M., I have read the accounts or official conversations with Sam Feen, discussions with Peter Bell in Belfast and with Cllr Jim Canning, who expressed concern that the Government has been ~~seen~~ become compromised by Sam Feen.

The overwhelming impression coming from the Sam Feen meeting is of studied unwillingness to come forward with any indication of what the IRA might say in a ceasefire. The consistent and practised evasiveness when this question was repeatedly raised is deeply disquieting. It suggests that

Rather they appear to be engaged in a tactical exercise to see what they can gain from a ceasefire, without making any strategic concession whatever — either material or even linguistic. This would tend to give ground to Comhaltas Cumann's fears.

I enclose a copy of a statement by Mr. G. Davis Fane which shows clearly the need for rearmance in any I.R.A. statement. — especially aspects marked (A).
