Governor of Hanover heretofore entrusted with the exercise of the kingly office in this government
hath endeavored to pervert the same into a detestable & insupportable tyranny

1. by putting his negative on laws the most wholesome & necessary for the public good
~~had kept some colonies without a representative assembly.~~

2. by denying to his governors permission to pass laws of ~~the most~~ immediate & pressing im-

portance, unless suspended in their operation for his ~~resent~~, & when so suspended

reflecting ~~the~~ on ~~on~~ to attend to them for many years:

3. by refusing to pass certain other laws, unless the persons to be benefited by them would
abandon the inalienable right of representation in the legislature

4. by dissolving legislative assemblies repeatedly & continually for opposing with manly force
- now his invasions on the rights of the people

5. when dissolved, by refusing to call others for a long space of time, thereby leaving the politi-

e. for transporting us beyond seas to be tried for pretended offences

f. for taking away our charters & offering fundamentally the forms of our governments

g. for suspending our own legislatures & declaring themselves invested with power

to legislate for us in all cases whatsoever

10. by plundering our seas, ravaging our coasts, burning our towns, & destroying the lives

of our people

11. by exciting insurrections of our fellow ~~subjects~~ ^{citizens} with the allurements of future & consecutive

12. by prompting our negroes to rise in arms among us; those very negroes whom he hath ~~been~~ ^{by an inhuman use of his negative}

~~to have refused us permission to exclude by law~~

13. by endeavoring to bring on the inhabitants of our frontiers the merciless Indian savages

~~whose known rule of warfare is an unmitigated destruction of all ages, sexes, & conditions~~

14. by transporting at this time a large army of foreign mercenaries to compleat the works of

~~death, desolation, & tyranny, already begun ~~so~~ ^{with circumstances of cruelty & perfidy} to make~~ the head of a civilized people

15. by answering our repeated petitions ~~for redress of their respective grievances~~ ^{for redress of their respective grievances}: ~~for~~ ^{for} ~~and finally,~~ ^{and finally,} by the help of government & deluding us out of the elegance & protection

~~and by various other acts of tyranny too often enumerated to need repetition, and too~~

~~by which several acts of mine the 1st George ^{only has rejected the kingly office and has rendered it necessary} ^{for the preservation of the people that he} ^{should be immediately deposed from the kingly}~~

~~office & divested of all its' privileges, powers, & prerogatives~~
