PRIME MINISTER'S VISIT TO DUBLIN: POSSIBLE ECUMENICAL SERVICE IN LIVERPOOL CATHEDRAL AND THE BELFAST/DUBLIN MOTORWAY

Veronica Sutherland sent you a copy of her letter of 12 December.

I do not think the Prime Minister is familiar with the back history or the arguments. It would be helpful if you could encapsulate them briefly in some advice to me. That said, for diary reasons alone I must warn that the odds are heavily against committing the Prime Minister to an ecumenical service next year. His diary is already heavily over-subscribed. It would be useful to know whether you would give the proposed ecumenical service precedence, as a call on his time, over a day spent in Northern Ireland. Would it be possible to combine it with talks with the Taoiseach?

Belfast/Dublin Motorway

I would also welcome your advice, and that of the Cabinet Office and Foreign and Commonwealth Office, on Veronica's proposal that the Belfast/Dublin road should be upgraded. She says that there is a long history to this question.

The rail-link from Dublin through Belfast and Larne to Stranraer and beyond features on the list of Trans-European Networks, on which Brian Bender is our resident expert. Would there be any chance of adding the road link to this list and making it a European project? No doubt that possibility has already been considered.
