Belfast City Council is planning to host a major international Economic Development Conference on 1st, 2nd and 3rd May 1996.

The proposed theme for the Conference is sharing successful experience. Through this we intend to highlight some of the positive aspects of Economic Development in Belfast and Northern Ireland while working at successful models worldwide.
